Be well, carry on. See you there! Kirk Williamson, President USS Conyngham Association


## Treasurer's Message

Annual Reunion - Philadelphia PA, June 10, 2023



#### **DD-371**

My mom passed away yesterday, the little girl on the left. Her father, Caleb Laning, was an executive officer on the USS Conyngham DD-371 when it was moored in Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. My mother and sister rode in the car to the harbor with their parents that morning to get my grandfather to his ship when the attack began. Their car was strafed by Japanese fighter planes. The strafing, explosions and bombs falling are all part of my mom's first memories in life; she was 4 years old. December 7th was always a meaningful day in my family since it was witnessed and survived by my mother, aunt, and grandparents. December 7th will be particularly hard for us as we no longer have her to re-tell the story of our family on that day. But I can take comfort in knowing that the foursome in this picture will all be together again on Dec 7.





## Here are some historical events related to the U.S. Navy:

- 1781: The French fleet defeats the British at Yorktown, Virginia.
- 1794: Congress authorizes the construction of six frigates after Barbary pirates destroy U.S. commerce.
- 1798: President John Adams signs a congressional act establishing the Department of the Navy.
- 1910: The Navy Department organization first mentions aviation.
- 1918: The USS Tampa is lost with 118 people.

On September 26, 1918, the USS Tampa was torpedoed and sunk by the German submarine UB-91 off the coast of England. The Tampa was sailing alone through the Bristol Channel to the Welsh port of Milford Haven to re-coal. The ship sank in just under three minutes, so quickly that none of the 131 people aboard had time to signal for help. The Tampa was stricken from the Navy list on September 26, 1918. The Tampa was the highest American naval combat casualty loss in World War I.

- 1931: The keel of the USS Ranger (CV 4) is laid, making it the first aircraft carrier designed and built.
- 1944: The USS Archerfish (SS 311) sinks the Japanese carrier Shinano, the largest warship sunk by a submarine during World War II.

The USS Archerfish (SS/AGSS-311) was a Balao-class submarine built in 1943 at the Portsmouth Navy Yard in New Hampshire. It was the first US Navy ship to be named after the archerfish. The Archerfish is best known for sinking the Japanese aircraft carrier Shinano in 1944, the largest warship ever sunk by a submarine. The Archerfish was decommissioned in 1946 and placed in the Pacific Reserve Group berthed at Mare Island, California.

## The U.S. Navy's official birthday is October 13, 1775, the day the Continental Navy was established. Some other facts about the U.S. Navy include:

- It is the world's largest navy
- Six U.S. presidents served in the Navy during World War II
  - Lieutenant John F. Kennedy, USNR
  - o Commander Lyndon B. Johnson, USNR
  - o Commander Richard M. Nixon, USNR
  - Lieutenant Commander Gerald R. Ford, USNR
  - o Lieutenant James Earl Carter Jr., USN
  - o Lieutenant George H.W. Bush, USNR
